
New-look Newsletter


MEMBERSHIP & PROGRAM



The guest speaker for our July meeting was **Julie Byrne-King** from Peer Based Harm Reduction WA, a consumer-led organisation that provides health and harm reduction services for people who use drugs. It is a part of the national network of Australian drug user organisations and is the state's largest Needle & Syringe Program provider, operating fixed-site, mobile, and outreach (home delivery) needle & syringe exchanges.

Almarie January, a member of our Bunbury Club, was our guest speaker for the August Meeting. Almarie grew up in South Africa as a Cape Coloured during the Apartheid era (1950-1994), which meant living in a world where division was enforced and dignity was something she had to fight for every day. Opportunities for women of colour were limited, but she overcame all obstacles and became a teacher as she sees education as a tool of liberation.

In 2013, Almarie and her family migrated to Western Australia, where she teaches her students, opens their minds, creates safe spaces and shows young people – especially girls – that their voices matter.







Zonta Spirit and Core Values

At our August Meeting, President Amanda presented an activity on Zonta Spirit and Core Values, where each member wrote down their reasons for joining Zonta and why they stay. We then circulated to share our answers.

Sexual Assault Project 113 Update

Tyril contacted Dr Katrina Stratton, who has succeeded Dr Sally Talbot as our representative in the WA Legislative Assembly. The issue of consent is still under review. Eventually, WA legislation will be amended so that a person who is drugged or intoxicated cannot legally be considered to have given consent—addressing this serious gap in the current law.

Our club, along with other Zonta clubs across Australia, has been invited to join a united advocacy effort addressing the growing homelessness crisis in the country. The Advocacy Committee is currently preparing information on this initiative to present to members

Letter to our local member

Mr. Ben Small MP was elected as the Federal Member for the electorate of Forrest. As we did not receive a response to our initial correspondence prior to the election, a follow-up letter was sent in August to introduce our organisation and pose four key questions regarding issues affecting women and girls. We are currently awaiting his response.
